- 1) Approval of Agenda C Stanley called the meeting to order at 12.30 p.m. S McCutcheon moved, C White seconded, that the agenda be approved. Carried.
- 2) Approval of minutes of 8 February, 2014, Annual General Meeting, Wolfville, NS G Wach moved, A Ruffman seconded, that the minutes of the 2014 Annual General Meeting be approved as circulated. Carried.
- 3) Matters Arising from the Minutes None
- 4) Presentation of the Financial Report C Campbell and N Koziel provided financial statements (appended). J Bates moved, J Gosse seconded, that the report be accepted. Carried.
- 5) Appointment of Financial Reviewers for 2015 I Spooner and J Gosse volunteered to review the books for 2015. I Spooner and J Gosse were acclaimed.

Report from Science Atlantic (Earth Science) Committee (M Graves) – M Graves reported that the annual AGS/Science Atlantic speaker series is about to commence, with lectures provided by Deanne van Rooyen and Chris McFarlane. The Science Atlantic (Earth Science) Committee also provides logistical support to the AUGC, which will be at St. Mary's University in the fall, and

coordinates the judging at the AGS colloquium. Milton will be stepping down as chair when he retires in June.

- 7) GAC-MAC conference, co-hosted by AGS in Fredericton, 2014 D Lentz thanked the members of the Local Organizing Committee, and the sponsors, including the AGS. He reported that there were 704 registrants, with a large student contingent. The surplus from the meeting is approaching \$100,000, of which GAC and MAC take a portion, and the remainder will be returned to UNB for student support.
