NCW005	16/12/1936	2	Letter to Miss A.M. Going from Selby Walker	This letter has Walker explaining the benefits of creating a Youth Hostel Association providing unemployed migrants the opportunity for shelter and for time spent on the land.
NCW006	05/01/1937	2	Letter to Miss A.M. Going from Selby Walker	Walker is explaining the importance of his organization in providing health, recreation and leisure services in a time of unemployment so that continued attention will be paid to these by migrant workers. He is attempting to get her to agree.
NCW007	09/01/1937	2	Letter to Miss A.M. Going from Selby Walker	Walker is expressing his concern over a recent radio address proclaiming a new Ministry of Sport which he thinks needs to be a Minister of Recreation as it will satisfy a broader array of subjects and would be more beneficial in times of dire straits.
NCW008	14/01/1937	2	Letter to Miss Lola Francis from Selby Walker	Walker references his correspondence with Miss Going and further explains to Francis that he is hoping that a string of youth hostels could be constructed in Eastern Canada. This he believes will connect the country and provide a national framework for development and employment during the Depression.
NCW009	15/01/1937	1	CNPA Circular #34 – “A Ministry of Recreation”	This newsletter argues that despite recent attempts to develop a Ministry of Sport in the Federal government, the government should broaden their horizons and create a Ministry of Recreation that will oversee health, recreation, and tourism in coordination with provincial and municipal groups.

NCW010	18/01/1937	3 (loose)	Letter to Mrs. Edgar D. Hardy from Miss A.M. Going	Letter forwarding all correspondence between Going and Walker. Also includes an emergency resolution to be tabled for the spring meeting of the NCW executive calling on Prime Minister King to change the Ministry of Sports to the Ministry of Recreation.
NCW011	20/01/1937	1	Letter to Miss A.M. Going from Mrs. Edgar D. Hardy	Letter acknowledging receipt of the resolution and explanation that it will be put into the agenda.
NCW012	22/01/1937	1	Letter to Mrs. Edgar D. Hardy from Miss A.M. Going	Letter explaining that the original resolution has become obsolete in days past however if Selby Walker continues to want support from the NCW, then she will re-write the resolution and send it at a later date.
NCW013	17/02/1937	1	Letter to Selby Walker from Mrs. Edgar D. Hardy	Letter to Walker explaining that membership by the NCW for the CNPA has been authorized and a cheque will follow shortly.
NCW014	03/03/1937	1	Letter to Selby Walker from Mrs. Edgar D. Hardy	Letter accompanying membership fees from NCW to CNPA.
NCW015	08/03/1937	1	Letter to Mrs. Edgar D. Hardy from Selby Walker	Letter thanking Hardy for the membership fee and explaining that he hopes the two organizations can work together in developing youth hostels in eastern Canada.
NCW016	09/03/1937	1	Letter to Miss Lola Francis from Selby Walker	Letter explaining further his desire for both the NCW and CNPA to develop a hostel strategy for eastern Canada that could even be ready for the summer of that year.
NCW017	16/04/1937	3 (third page is loose)	Letter to Miss Lola Francis from Selby Walker	Walker has enclosed a pamphlet explaining the hostel system used in Alberta and explains that if they want to maintain a system similar to that in Europe, they must establish a firm base in Eastern Canada first.
NCW018	23/06/1937	1	Letter to Selby Walker from Mrs. Edgar D. Hardy	Letter explaining that although they do believe in developing a hostel system, they are unwilling at the time to endorse, until at least they have enough information on the topic.
NCW019	No date	1	Canadian National Parks Association Statement of Account	Statement sent to NCW to ensure membership dues will be paid.
NCW020	01/12/1938	1	Letter to Selby Walker from Mrs. Edgar D. Hardy	Letter (with cheque) enclosing membership fees for NCW in CNPA for upcoming year.

NCW021	05/12/1938	2	Letter to Mrs. Edgar D. Hardy from Selby Walker	Letter expressing thanks for continued membership and explaining that with the broadening influence of the CNPA, they are attuned to national interests. For that purpose, he is calling on the NCW to strengthen their actions for tourism so as to make Canada a more copasetic environment for American tourists.
NCW022	08/12/1938	2	Letter to Mrs. Edgar D. Hardy from Selby Walker	Letter explaining that with the vulnerability of Britain in their war with Germany, Canada must create opportunities for British industry to set up Canadian branches and the first step is to develop arterial highways in western Canada. He calls on the NCW to support this initiative.
NCW023	10/12/1938	1	Letter to Mrs. Edgar D. Hardy from Robert Stead	Letter thanking the NCW for continued support the National Parks Bureau and an offering of mutual support between the two organizations.
NCW024	14/12/1938	1	Letter to Robert Stead from Mrs. Edgar D. Hardy	Responding with thanks to letter from Robert Stead.
NCW025	06/04/1939	2	Letter to Mrs. Edgar D. Hardy from Selby Walker	Letter admonishing the current system in place for works relief projects. He believes they have received nothing despite the money being spent and compares the conditions in Canada with that of the United States.
NCW026	14/04/1939	1	Letter to Selby Walker from Mrs. Edgar D. Hardy	Letter acknowledging receipt of Walker's letter (NCW025).
NCW027	18/04/1939	1	Letter to Mrs. Edgar D. Hardy from Selby Walker	Letter stating that the previous letter may not be interesting to the entire NCW membership as most of it is of an administrative nature. Walker explains that there is a different article which would better describe the activities of the CNPA.
